

More Than Words: Understanding Legislation

Overview

Legislation is pivotal to our society. Rights and obligations flow from legislation. Access to services and entitlement to benefits may depend on meeting statutory criteria. Obligations may be imposed and limitations placed on private actions by legislation. Many public sector roles require an understanding of legislation. Provision of advice to the public as to rights, ability to access government services or compliance processes may ultimately require an understanding of legislation and how it operates. Public sector roles often require a translation of legislation into processes which are legally compliant, yet practical. The focus of the course is to provide a general understanding of how to interpret and apply legislation.
