This National Strategic Plan sets out a collaborative approach for the Institute of Public Administration Australia (IPAA), as the national body for those involved in public administration across Australia. The plan is both ambitious and pragmatic. It charts a course for an active, articulate, and contemporary professional body, supporting outcomes for public sector and for the Australian community.

The plan was developed over a six-month period by IPAA's National Council in consultation with each of our eight Divisions. As a confederated body, the plan reflects and complements the current strategic plans of IPAA Divisions, providing an overarching national context for IPAA's operations.

Delivery under the plan will be supported by an annual implementation plan, co-designed by the Chief Executive Officers and Executive Directors of each IPAA Division and IPAA's National Executive Director.

This National Strategic Plan will provide IPAA with the framework to realise our vision of increasing membership across each jurisdiction, expanding and enriching our offerings at a national level, and building stronger connections between people working in the public sector and the wider public purpose sector.

Ultimately IPAA is here to support our public services in the great work they do to improve the lives of all Australians.





ABOUT IPAA

The Institute for Public Administration Australia (IPAA) is a member-based, national organisation for those involved in public administration across Australia.

IPAA has strong relationships and works with the wider public purpose sector — including the university, community, not-forprofit and professional services sectors — to support the delivery of public services and policy that improves the lives of Australians. This involves unique partnerships, memberships and evolving relationships in each jurisdiction.

While this strategic plan reflects the commonality of IPAA's work across Australia, we recognise and value the differences that each Division brings in terms of diversity of intent, purpose, membership, and business models. IPAA is proudly apolitical, nonpartisan and not-for-profit. We became a confederated national organisation in 1980. Each of the eight IPAA Divisions were established prior to 1980 as regional groups of the Institute of Public Administration based in London. Our first regional group was formed in South Australia in 1927.

OUR ENVIRONMENT, PARTNERS, AND STAKEHOLDERS

IPAA is a member-based organisation. Many of our members are drawn from the various public services across Australia as well as the university, community, not-forprofit and professional services sectors.

Our Divisions are independent entities that come together as a confederated national organisation. Some are not-for-profit companies; others are run entirely by volunteers.

Across our eight Divisions and nationally, IPAA employs about 40 staff — we like to think we punch above our weight! The year 2020 saw IPAA pivot in response to the COVID-19 pandemic with a rapid transition to digital delivery. IPAA is working to provide members with safe networking opportunities that combine the best of face-to-face and digital delivery.

IPAA partners with a broad crosssection of organisations including government organisations, professional services firms, banks and financial institutions, technology companies, legal firms, recruiting firms, universities, and publishers. As well as collaborating with IPAA and providing in-kind support, a number of these organisations also provide support to IPAA's events program and member activities through active sponsorship.

Speaking out as the voice of Australia's public sectors

Action 1

IPAA, through the National President, speaks on matters of importance to the profession, engaging with the media, collaborating with state, national and international counterparts, making submissions to inquiries, and facilitating conversations with public sector leaders from across Australia.

Action 2

IPAA recognises individuals who have made exceptional contributions to IPAA and the profession.

Supporting professional excellence in Australia's public sectors

Action 1

IPAA provides cross-jurisdictional professional development opportunities.

Action 2

IPAA shares nationally relevant news, research and public administration insights, and promotes its forward events program to Australian public administrators.

Action 3

IPAA works with other organisations to build and promote an expanding body of evidence to support 'future-ready' public sectors.

Building national and international partnerships

Action 1

IPAA builds relationships with national and international organisations to promote excellence in Australia's public sectors.

Action 2

IPAA partners with organisations in the delivery of its National Strategic Plan.

Improving our structures and processes

Action 1

IPAA modernises its National Constitution and Governance Charter to ensure they are contemporary and fit for purpose.

Action 2

IPAA develops and implements a national corporate membership model for the benefit of the organisation and its members.

DELIVERING THE PLAN

IPAA's National Strategic Plan will be delivered through the combined strength of the IPAA Divisions, the National Council, and the National Secretariat and supported by a national budget that is augmented by in-kind contributions from IPAA Divisions, and sponsorship from strategic partners. The National Council have tasked the Chief Executive Officers and Executive Directors of the eight IPAA Divisions, the National Executive Director to co-design and deliver an annual Implementation Plan to support the delivery of this National Strategic Plan.

MEASURING SUCCESS



The National Secretariat will work with the Chief Executive Officers and Executive Directors of the eight IPAA Divisions to develop a monitoring, evaluation and reporting process and plan that enables the National Council to measure IPAA's success in delivering the National Strategic Plan.



REFINING THE PLAN

The National Secretariat will coordinate quarterly reporting on progress in delivering the Plan to the National Council as well as an annual report on progress and recommendations for improvement.

The National Council will review the Plan in the first quarter of each new financial year and allocate a national budget to support its delivery. IPAA will also work with its strategic national partners to secure sponsorship for signature national events and new initiatives.

OPPORTUNITIES TO PARTNER WITH IPAA

IPAA works closely with a number of organisations to give effect to our purpose.

'Commitment to connection'

The painting was commissioned by IPAA ACT in 2021. IPAA ACT manages IPAA's national program in partnership with the National Council and IPAA Divisions around Australia.

"'Commitment to connection tells the story of IPAA ACT and their commitment to Canberra and community, including their ongoing journey of reflection, respect and reconciliation.

The overall concept reflects connection with the private, public, peak bodies and academic sectors and relationships with the other state and territory IPAAs coming together to share expertise and knowledge. Debating, collaborating, innovating, communicating and building capability in public administration. In particular it shows IPAA ACT as a conduit to connect. The colours and elements of 'Commitment to connection' are inspired by those seen in the Canberra region.

The leaves of a eucalyptus, the most common native trees in the region but also common in other regions of Australia, represents IPAA ACT and the other sectors coming together in an abstract royal bluebell shape to represent Canberra. The colours of the leaves were inspired by the colours I see during autumn in the region.

Since moving to the region nearly a decade ago, I am still mesmerized by the beautiful colours seen in the distinct seasons experience in the region, autumn included. The royal bluebell's yellow centre represents IPAA ACT and the sectors coming together, the royal bluebell petals represent each of the sectors coming together, the royal bluebell represents the ACT community. Surrounded on the outside by IPAA QLD, NSW, VIC, NT, WA, SA, TAS to represent their connection to the Australian community."
